E&I Taskforce

- ❑ Established after MSF 8 that prioritized *Enhanced actions towards Inclusive and Equitable WaSH program* as an undertaking
- ❑ Start up meeting conducted in July, 2017 led by the National ONE WASH Coordination office
- ❑ The team agreed that there should be short term, immediate priorities that mainly relate to implementing the MSF undertaking
- ❑ The taskforce should take the lead in insuring that equity and inclusion concerns are incorporated in upcoming review of policy and strategies



In terms of structures it was discussed that a taskforce leading the discussion and implementation should be established under the ONE WASH National Coordination Office including the following institutions:

- MOE
- MOH
- COWASH
- WaterAid

Objective

Provide forums for Government, Development Partners (including NGOs and DPOs) and academic organizations to jointly promote, advocate, share and coordinate sustainable and integrated development of equity and inclusion in WASH.



Scope

Gender equality and women's empowerment (more than 50% of the population)




People with Disabilities (World report on disability ~ 9 million people in Ethiopia/ WB estimates up to 15 million)
